

Resources Management

Environment

Discover to what extent having multiple geographic locations and particular project team setup with multiple languages skills is influencing the performance of projects.

Personnel

Understand to what extent the following influences performance: personality, project team language mix, individual team member skills. Identify learning and development needs of an individual to meet future requirements.

Experience

Determine whether the project team members have sufficient training and experience from previous projects to perform future project tasks.

Applications & IT resources

Evaluate whether the project team has appropriate access to software tools to complete their tasks satisfactorily and are familiar with how to use them. Understand the impact of the office facilities and availability of IT resources for project specific needs.

Teams

Establish how the following project and department characteristics have influenced project performance: project ownership, team structure, ratios between different project roles.
